When Bob and I first met in 1981 he owned a 1972 Porsche 911 (which he still has). 





A tour to Camano Island was canceled. Bruce went over the details of the past Autocross earlier in the month. There was some misunderstandings for the reimbursement of the free passes that would allow those to

attend the Trans Am races; a communications breakdown seems to exist between CMCS and Larry McCue. Howard and DeAnn Esping, Stephen Jones, John Viet, Don Schwab, Donald and Janice Wright were all voted into membership. Club jackets are now available only through retail stores.
