

40 LAPS AGO: August '71. The Board of Directors monthly meet was held at the home of Dee and Howard Esping. Frank Diss is the club's editor of our monthly newsletter but he is looking for an assistant to help out. There was a late-month tour to Okanogan. Membership stands at the present level but one prospective member is qualified to be voted in at the next meeting. The ordered walkie talkies will be here next month. (Note: the above mentioned

occurrences were recorded from the Board Officer Monthly minutes and from OYM newsletters I have in my possession. There are no General Membership Meeting minutes in the club's histories for the month of August 1991. There is some precedence of a history of this occurring in the Month of August in the club's early years where no club meeting either did not take place formally, or, were not recorded for posterity. In these cases I must rely on other sources at hand. This is true as well with the December Board Monthly meeting being dispensed with in the late years of the club with respects to the holiday family commitments for all our club members. Whenever I must rely upon available Board Meeting minutes to mention here, I will only record generalized mention of club 'activities' and will not post details of our club's business the Board Officers discuss amongst themselves for the betterment of CMCS. All your club's Histories are available for personal review by all members in good standing per a request of such to the Board for approval - Ben)

30 LAPS AGO: August '81. Vice President Cece Nelson fills in for the absent President Ernie Kahler and gets the monthly meeting started after lunch at The Flame Restaurant in Kirkland. A good selection of events around the Puget Sound region took place; Tour to the NCRS 12th Vintage Corvette Picnic at Rainbow Falls Park, Seafair Torchlight Parade seeing 16 Corvettes participating from our club, Parking Sessions & SIR for Funny Car Drags, NWACC Rally & Autocross at Vancouver WA, CMCS General Membership meeting & Brunch at The Flame Restaurant in Kirkland, SCCASports Car Road Races at SIR, and, the All Corvette Drag Race & Swap Meet at SIR. Frank O reported on last month's bicycle 'weekend long' outing at Fort Flagler from a story in the monthly OYM newsletter. Membership chair Jan Cockrum reported that there are a total of 96 members after Kemp Frazer was voted into full membership. A newsletter article forwarded 'by love from Bruce' entails the start of an incredible odyssey undertaken by Bruce Kelly of a bicycle adventure in London, England and the country side, then catching a ferry to France and beginning his own

Tour d' France homage while trying to understand strange roadside markings, like "cul de sac..." Bruce ends his first report mentioning he 'wished he had Frank O's legs, but, then again they weren't as pretty as his own.'

20 LAPS AGO: August '91. President John Bell provides the leadership at Rose Eckenbergs home in Lake Stevens to celebrate the club's annual Summer Barbecue and General Membership Meeting. Dee Esping noted membership at 101. Gary Main reported the upcoming club activities; Majestic Glass car show in Anacortes, the Beach Party at the Eckenbergs, NWCA All Corvette Cruise-In, Car Show Grand Old Days in Auburn North, a Tour to Mt. Rainier, Western Corvette Supply's Fall Show n Shine, NWCA Corvette Challenge weekend, and a NCRS car show at the Columbia Winery. Volunteers are being solicited to take over as Activities Chairperson, Dee will head up the Christmas party organization, John Thomas is handling the NWACC Banquet held at the Silver Cloud Inn in Renton, catered by Renton Vo-Tech with a Rallye in the afternoon, John Paul Nelson III reported a good show at the Greenwood parade last May 31st, and the Woodinville Wine Festival is scheduled for September 15th at Columbia Winery and we will combine that event with our monthly meeting. John Thomas, newsletter editor noted that he is going to drop the expanded format in favor of meeting the 1 oz. postal rate to save mailing costs of our newsletter. The Club received a thank you letter from the National Corvette Museum for our purchase of a commemorative brick, Cruzin' Magazine is organizing a Western Washington Council of car clubs to protect the interest of automobile enthusiasts, kick off meeting was held on the 21st as John & Cece Nelson attended as our representatives. Club activities included the W.O.W. weekend tour to Cannon Beach, Oregon, joining others at the 14th Thunder in the Mountains in Whistler, BC, attending the Seafair GM Hydroplane Races, NCRS NW Chapter meet in Bend, Oregon, The 2nd Good Samaritan Foundation car classic meet in Puyallup at the Four Sisters, a Mystery Rally to Mt Hood, Oregon, the 5th Annual Corvette Club's Show n Shine at Seaview Chevrolet in Lynnwood, the 11th 5 Star 2001 with Classical Glass of Tacoma at the Emerald Queen Casino, the 8th Annual Take Me Out To The Ball Game with FrogStock 2001 night at the Everett Aquasox stadium, Majestic Glass's Corvette show in Anacortes, the Wild Wild West Vette Fest in West Yellowstone, Montana, and the Open House at LeMay in Parkland, WA. Parades attended were in Magnolia and Lake City. Rick Milsow writes an article for the newsletter on his trip back to St. Louis and the birth place of his '66 Corvette, and another from Gary Main; In Memory of Roy Robinson, a past club sponsor from Marysville who passed away last month from cancer. Club Secretary Jane Shimanek places an ad in the newsletter's Classifieds; CMCS Secretary's notebook missing with meeting minutes prior to 1999, both general & Executive minutes which are not published. be delivered the next day; thanks go to the Mains, Dagers, Mona Cox & the Jewells for assisting, Gary Main's newsletter article note Shoreline Community College receives a new 2007 Corvette donated from GM for the Professional Automotive Training Center. Pictures of the Magnolia and Lake City parades are published in the newsletter. Dennis Montgomery writes an article for the newsletter noting of each day's events for next month's SIS 2006 event. Another article notes the Adopt-A-Highway program has been renewed with the state through February 2008. Rick Milsow noted 53 registered cars showed for the School Daze event at Pacific Raceways even thought it rained a little, all had a great time. The last parade of the year was the Salmon Days Parade in Issaquah.
